QUALIFICATION AND APPLICATION PROCESS

Candidate's minimum requirements include:

- Possess a Doctor of Pharmacy degree from an ACPE accredited college of pharmacy
- Eligible for New Hampshire licensure

Residency candidates must participate in the Resident Matching Program and PhORCAS.

Completed application in PhORCAS by January 11, 2019 which should include:

- Curriculum Vitae
- Letter of intent
- 3 letters of recommendation
- Official college of pharmacy transcripts

Potential candidates will be invited for an on-site interview. A 20-30 minute PowerPoint presentation is required.

Duration of residency: 12 months

Residency start date: July 1st of each year

Number of positions: 2

Estimated stipend per year: \$47,000
